
There are 316,813 children ages 5 and under in Oklahoma.

While 59% of children ages 5 and under live in households in which all parents work, 21% of all children in this age group live in families below the poverty line (\$21,960).¹






Quality early care and learning programs contribute to both thriving economies and healthy families.


