

Importance of Modernizing Technology to Enable Epic EHR

Epic EHR is industry standard used by 95% of academic health systems

- Provides an always-on network and infrastructure with patient access anytime, anywhere
- Enables Epic implementation to improve patient care
- Allows providers in any location to see all relevant information
- Streamlines clinical trial launch and administration
- Ensures medical education is up to date (physicians/nurses)
- Helps recruit/retain top talent
- Increases efficiency

EHRs Improve Workforce Development

- OU Health Physicians is the state's largest physician group

- Aids nurse & physician retention by lifting administrative burdens on clinicians


Investing in infrastructure is *key* to elevating OU Health

- Freestanding children's hospital
 - Level 4 NICU
 - Pediatric heart surgery program



Technology Modernization Ask

OU Health/OU/UHAT are already investing over \$200 million in digital transformation

TOTAL ASK: \$44 MILLION

- \$25.1 million to upgrade network to accommodate Epic
- **\$7.4 million** to modernize end-user infrastructure and devices
- **\$6.5 million** to create robust server/storage environment to protect patient data
- **\$5 million** to merge OU Physicians into OU Health network
