

OVERVIEW


In an average year, 735 people die and 1,244 are wounded by guns in Oklahoma. Oklahoma has the 13th-highest rate of gun violence in the US.

GUN DEATHS OVER TIME

In Oklahoma, the rate of gun deaths increased 25% from 2011 to 2020, compared to a 33% increase nationwide. The rate of gun suicides increased 14% and gun homicides increased 57% compared to a 12% increase and 70% increase nationwide, respectively.



COST OF GUN VIOLENCE

Oklahoma has the 13th-highest societal cost of gun violence in the US at \$2,595 per resident each year. Gun deaths and injuries cost Oklahoma \$10.3 billion each year, of which \$206 million is paid by taxpayers.



- Safe storage measures, such as locked gun cabinets and secure gun safes, can reduce the likelihood of unauthorized access to firearms.
- Laws and initiatives promoting responsible gun ownership and storage are crucial in preventing school shootings.

The US Secret Service found that roughly three-quarters of school shooters acquired their firearm from the home of a parent or close relative.


4.6 million children in the US live in a home with at least one unlocked and loaded firearm.



GUN SUICIDES AND SUICIDE ATTEMPTS

Every year, an average of 486 people in Oklahoma die by gun suicides and 44 are wounded by gun suicide attempts—a rate of 12.0 suicides and 1.1 suicide attempts per 100,000 people. Oklahoma has the 7th-highest rate of gun suicides and gun suicide attempts in the US.


Gun Suicides By Race/Ethnicity in Oklahoma



GUN HOMICIDES AND ASSAULTS

Every year, an average of 234 people in Oklahoma die by gun homicides and 469 are wounded by gun assaults—a rate of 6.2 homicides and 11.9 assaults per 100,000 people. Oklahoma has the 15th-highest rate of gun homicides and gun assaults in the US. In Oklahoma, 74% of all homicides involve a gun, compared to 76% nationwide.

☐ Gun Storage Devices Tax Exemptions.

- Creating financial incentives to purchase secure storage devices has the potential to create a ripple effect of positive change within the community. It encourages open conversations about firearm safety. It fosters a sense of community responsibility and underscores the idea that we are all in this together, working towards a safer, more compassionate society.
- A recent example of this growing trend can be seen in the state of Louisiana. In a significant move to incentivize responsible firearm storage, Louisiana passed a secure storage tax credit. This innovative legislation allows Louisiana residents to claim up to \$500 in tax credits for the purchase of secure storage devices. This forward-thinking approach not only encourages safer firearm practices but also provides a tangible benefit to those who take steps to protect their communities and loved ones.
- The passage of secure storage laws and initiatives like Louisiana's tax credit program exemplify the ongoing efforts of states to strike a balance between respecting Second Amendment rights and ensuring the safety of their citizens. As these laws continue to gain traction, they serve as a testament to our collective commitment to creating a safer and more responsible firearm ownership culture nationwide.



Most recently, Louisiana, Tennessee and North Carolina passed secure storage tax credits.
