#### Community Health Services - Division 40

This division is responsible for providing services to Oklahomans in 68 county health departments.

#### Personal Health Services - Division 45

This division is responsible for : Educating Oklahomans on chronic diseases, immunization, monitoring and preventing injuries.

#### Oklahoma Athletic Commission - Division 50

Implement the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission Act and protect, maintain and improve the safety and welfare of the participants of professional boxing, wrestling, and kickboxing, as well as the general public.

#### Quality Assurance & Regulatory - Division 55

This division is responsible for the regulatory functions of the Department. Among the industries regulated are : medical facilities, long term care facilities, food service industry, tattoo and body piercing industries, emergency management systems, midwives, professional counselors and other occupations.

#### Health Improvement Services - Division 85

This division is responsible for engaging communities to promote public health, addressing core public health issues of tobacco use and obesity, and the management of public health information. Service areas in HIS include the Center for the Advancement of Wellness, Community Development, and the Center for Health Statistics.

### Information Services - Division 88

This is the division where all IT transactions occur.
