
Early Voting Cleveland County



We've tried to spread our early voting sites out across the county, and secure them in areas of population concentration.


Depending on which entity/entities call an election we open the site/sites closest to that district.

For example on August 12, 2025 The City of Moore and Mid-America Technology Center had elections. So, for early voting we opened our site in Moore, and our sites in Noble and east Norman which were in the Mid-America District. Since Oklahoma City and Norman did not have elections our South OKC and Norman sites remained closed.

For county-wide/state-wide elections like the Board of Education, Primary Election, Runoff Primary, and General Election next year all six of our sites will be open.

Ballot Cabinets

Cleveland County has 105 voting precincts. So, each early voting site has four secure rolling cabinets to house every ballot style for all of the county's precincts. (We use 4 ballot cabinets at each in-person absentee site.)

Utility Carts

A large utility cart is used at each site to transport and secure the forms, laptops, printers and other materials used to conduct early voting.

Four laptops with the Modern Election
Support Application (MESA) are used at each
site to process voters and assign voter
history credit. Each site also requires
printers, an internet hot-spot, VPN
keys/tokens, and additional materials to
ensure everything thing runs smoothly.

The initial cost for Cleveland County to add an additional early voting sites is about \$15,000.

There are ongoing costs associated with operating our additional early voting sites as well. Each election we have additional absentee voting boards, increased costs from the moving company who delivers election supplies, and additional polling place rental charges. We are very fortunate to have the support we do from our County Officials to be able to make this happen.
