Second Regular Session of the Sixtieth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Fifteenth Legislative Day, Wednesday, February 25, 2026

The Senate was called to order by Senator Hamilton.

HB 3465 – By Boles and Hill of the House and Green of the Senate.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending Section 7, Chapter 346, O.S.L. 2022 (68 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 55012), which relates to the termination date for the Oklahoma Emission Reduction Technology Incentive Act; increasing termination date by three years; and providing an effective date.

HB 4329 – By Moore, Archer and Banning of the House and Thompson of the Senate.

An Act relating to dental insurance claims; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 7301, which relates to dental plans; modifying definition; and providing an effective date.

HB 4426 – By Hilbert and Hill of the House and Hall of the Senate.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending Section 1, Chapter 340, O.S.L. 2022, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 164, O.S.L. 2024 (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2357.105), which relates to income tax credit for qualified economic development expenditures; extending date for which the credit will be in effect; and providing an effective date.

HCR 1019 – By Blair, Roberts, Grego, Hardin, Wilk, Johns and Kelley of the House and Standridge of the Senate.

A Concurrent Resolution supporting the official name of the planned turnpike to be constructed from Interstate 44 East to Interstate 35 continuing East and North to Interstate 40 as part of the ACCESS Oklahoma Long-Range Plan; commemorating the life and legacy of Toby Keith; directing distribution.
