*The Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission is composed of nine members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. At least one member shall be appointed from each of the six congressional districts and at least three of the remaining members shall be experienced in the horse industry and shall be appointed from the state at large. Each Commissioner is appointed for six (6) years and until a successor is appointed and qualified. With the exception of the five (5) initial terms which were shorter to create a two year stagger for appointments. During the 2005 Oklahoma Legislative Session structure and membership to the Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission was changed with the passage of Senate Bill 738.*

**MODERNIZATION EFFORTS:**

*The Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission is a small, unique agency. Our services are not like any other in state government. Since the beginning of the budget reductions in FY-2009 the OHRC's budget has been reduced by one-fifth or approximately \$590,000.00. Nonetheless, this agency has made every effort*

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*to streamline and modernize the agency's functions with the funding and personnel available. One such effort is that of digitalizing documents to be available for all staff members. Forms, applications, rulings, and historical documents are just a few of the documents the agency has begun to scan and archive internally. The agency has requested additional funding for this project, but the item was not addressed due to the current economical situation.*

*Another project the agency has attempted to utilize is the purchase of and ability to use digital fingerprinting. The agency has funding (non-appropriated) and legislative permission to proceed, but the receiving agency, OSBI, currently cannot accept our fingerprints digitally (across the internet) due to statutory restrictions and software/hardware issues.*

*What steps has the agency taken to cut costs and/or eliminate waste? Are there efforts that have been successful which you believe could serve as a model for other state agencies seeking to keep costs minimal?*

*Since the FY-2009 budget reductions began the agency has made the following cost savings:*

- 1. Returned leased vehicles to DCS.*
- 2. Reduced travel to only essential operations.*
- 3. Reduced Commissioner travel to Commission Meetings.*
- 4. Changed telephone service.*
- 5. Changed copiers*
- 6. Eliminated or reduced subscriptions to online services (i.e. Accurint, CLEAR, WestLaw, etc.)*
- 7. Any vacancies created by retirement or resignation have remained vacant until funding becomes available, unless it is essential (i.e., Stewards.)*
