MODERNIZATION EFFORTS:

Commerce continuously strives to modernize and achieve maximum efficiency in the delivery of its programs and services to businesses and communities. Through process improvement strategies, efforts are made to reduce operational costs. These endeavors are not prompted by statutory changes, but by a desire to focus on the customer and maximize available resources. To cut costs and eliminate waste, Commerce undertakes the following actions on a regular basis:

- Maintaining focus on the agency mission and actively partnering with other agencies, private entities, communities and citizens to enhance services

- Controlling discretionary operational costs
- Aligning actions and performance to strategy
