

The OID Acts:

Traveling to all 77 counties in the state to meet with consumers, fire departments, local leaders and insurance professionals.

Returning \$5.5 million in unspent funds to the state Legislature for Fiscal Year 2015.

Hosting eight Senior Fraud Conferences across the state to educate seniors on fraud and teach them how to protect themselves.



The OID Acts: ISO

960+ fire departments across the state. Statewide average ISO score is 9

300+ fire departments visits

OID's ISO division saw more than 175 departments lower their ISO rating as a result of OID's assistance.

A lower ISO rating has an immediate impact on the local homeowners' insurance rates.

Disaster Savings Accounts



Allows up to \$5,000 to be set aside tax-free, each year, for disaster recovery and risk mitigation expenses.

Flood Insurance




Increases private competition against the Federal Flood Insurance Program by allowing a surplus lines premium tax exemption on flood policies sold by Domestic companies for Oklahoma properties.

Public Adjusters



Clarifies that a public adjuster may only profit off of any net increase they obtain for their clients and not the entire settlement amount.

Service Warranty



Clarifies the Commissioner's authority to oversee out-of-state service warranty companies operating in Oklahoma.




Premium Tax
