VA per diem for nursing home care is paid for any Veteran who is eligible for such care in a VA facility (38 U.S.C. 1741). VA is also required to make higher nursing home per diem payments for certain Veterans with service-connected disabilities.(38 CFR 51.41 Hence, 100% of the federal revenue received by the agency is mandated by the federal government for the operation of all seven veterans centers.
