OSSM is not requesting additional funding regarding any aspects of the agency's operations for FY17. The increase received for FY16 enabled OSSM to admit all qualified Oklahoma students who desired to attend the residential campus for the school year 2015-2016.

Total Increase above FY-17 Request

How would the agency handle a 5% appropriation reduction in FY'17?

A 5% reduction for FY17 of \$328,000, combined with the estimated fixed cost increases, would result in a need to reduce approximately \$380,000 from the FY17 budget. The only realistic way to accomplish this is by reduction in personnel, resulting in a reduction in course offerings at the main campus and possible suspension of regional center sites. These actions would make it difficult for the agency to accomplish its mission and would significantly limit and potentially compromise the services provided. OSSM is developing ways to be more economically self sufficient. OSSM is actively recruiting out of state students who will pay a tuition to attend. This revenue source will help to offset any appropriation reduction, however, this revenue source is not guaranteed to be received from year to year.

How would the agency handle a 7.5% appropriation reduction in FY'17?

A 7.5% reductin for FY17 of \$490,000, combined with the estimated fixed cost increases, would result in a need to reduce approximately \$540,000 from the FY17 budget. Greater reductions in personnel, course offerings, and regional center sites would be necessary, resulting in a larger impact to students throughout the state.

How would the agency handle a 10% appropriation reduction in FY'17?

A 10% reduction for FY17 of \$657,000, combined with the estimated fixed cost increases, would result in a need to reduce approximately \$710,000 from the FY17 budget. This reduction amount would be detrimental to the operations of the agency, with an extensive reduction in personnel, course offerings, and regional center sites ensuing.
