As the official state library of Oklahoma, the Oklahoma Department of Libraries serves the information and records management needs of state government, assists with public library development, coordinates statewide library and information technology projects, and serves the general public through our specialized collections.



History and Overview of ODL

- Established as the Territorial Library in 1893 to serve the Territory's legislature and courts
- Independent agency with seven board members appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate
- Divisions include: Archives and Records,
 Information Services and Interlibrary Loan,
 Library Development, and Government Information
- Part of the Secretary of State's cabinet
- Operates with state funds,
 federal grants, and fee income




Priority One

\$100,000 increase in State Aid to Public Libraries

- Oklahoma's State Aid Program provides an incentive for public libraries to provide and maintain quality services to their communities.
- State Aid provides **people in every county access** to one or more public libraries **to check out materials**, **use electronic resources**, and **participate in programs**.
- State Aid is flexible so that individual libraries can use the funds where they will best improve services, resources, and programs.



2017 State Aid Expenditures




SFY 2018 **State Aid** is **almost \$1 million less** than in **SFY 2010**

Cuts to **State Aid negatively impacted** ...





Priority Two

\$25,000 Increase in State Literacy Grants

State Literacy Grants enhance services to Oklahoma's adult learners.

These grants provide educational materials to learners, tutors, and trainers; help local literacy councils hire ESL, ABE, and GED instructors; fund outreach to potential students; and support other operational expenses.



Local Literacy Programs say the Decrease in Literacy Grants has Negatively Impacted ...

- availability of tutoring and training materials
- number of class hours for ESL, ABE, and GED programs
- ability to pay instructors for these programs
- staffing levels
- purchase of literacy software programs
- confidence in beginning new programs



State dollars count toward the maintenance of effort (MOE) required to secure critical federal library dollars for Oklahomans.





Federal Dollars Provide

- Access to millions of full-text articles, plus homework help, for all types of libraries and for all ages
 - In FY2017 there were more than 146 million information searches
- Summer Reading programs for more than 99,000 children and teens
- Information technology training and continuing education for public library staff
 - # 577 library staff benefited from Public Librarian Certification Classes
- Health Literacy Grants that have so far helped 41
 communities with classes and resources to promote
 healthy lifestyles.

Because of the reduction
of State Dollars for Public
Library and Literacy
Programs, ODL is projecting
the loss of almost \$90,000
in Federal Funds for FY 2018



Request for New Funding for SFY19

- \$100,000 for State Aid Grants to public libraries
- \$25,000 for State Literacy Grants to literacy programs
