Urban Ag in the Farm Bill

\$25 Million Authorized for Urban Ag Initiatives

- Establishes new Office & Director of Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production – promote urban, indoor, and other emerging ag production practices.
- Establishes Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production Advisory Committee – report on development of policies and outreach, as well as implementation of urban ag provisions in the farm bill.
- Farm Numbers assigns farm numbers to rooftop, indoor, and other urban farms.

Additional Supports Needed for Urban Farmers

- Access to FSA loans
- Accessible urban farmland (i.e. leasing, agreements, tax incentive, property listings, etc.)
