

### Food Access, Income and Race/Ethnicity

- Research has demonstrated a high correlation between limited food access and high densities of:
  - Low-income households
  - Racial and ethnic minorities
- The issue of food access disproportionately impacts these lowresource households
- American Planning Association notes that "Food access is not simply a health issue but also a community development and equity issue."



### Implications for Limited Food Access

- SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) education is offered in Oklahoma and Tulsa Counties
- Studies have also shown that small incentives given to SNAP recipients to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables led to disproportionately large sales at farmers markets
- Higher risks for chronic diseases like high blood pressure, diabetes and cancer, not just for individuals but for entire neighborhoods
- One study found that greater access to full-service restaurants and groceries stores led to lower obesity and diabetes rates



#### Resources to Address Limited Food Access

- OK Small Business Development Center's partnership with OSU Extension: Farmers Market Manager Training, Local Food Matchup
- Oklahoma County Extension Office:
  - Located in the heart of NE OKC (most unhealthy zip code in OK County)
  - Demonstration greenhouse, teaching and community gardens
  - Partnerships with Jesus House, Restore OKC, etc.
- Tulsa County Extension Office:
  - Partnership with Tulsa County Department of Health
  - Annual Market Garden School (2019 Hosted by Langston University Tulsa)



## Opportunities to expand programs

- Urban and small farm horticulture specialist
- School-based programs on gardens and farming
- Food preparation and preservation programming
- Food and agriculture enterprise development
